**GENERAL MEETING**

The Swansea Town Council held its monthly meeting at the Swansea Municipal Building 320 West Third Street, SC.

Mayor Sanders called the meeting to order at 6:00 p.m., confirming the media was notified and the agenda had been posted at town hall and the police department. The Pledge of Allegiance was recited by all present. Afterward, Councilwoman Butler, lead us in prayer.

The consideration for the minutes to be approved from August 20<sup>th</sup>, 2018 was asked by the Mayor. Councilman Luongo put the motion on the floor second via Councilwoman Butler. It was a unanimous decision to approve minutes.

**MAYOR AND COUNCIL COMMENTS**

Mayor made an announcement of the public bike meeting was postpone due to the weather last week. The next meeting is scheduled for October 2, 2018 from 5 to 7 pm with our bike and pedestrian master plan.

Crime Watch meeting was last week with the Fire Department who spoke with our community about fire prevention and smoke alarms. Another Crime Watch meeting is scheduled for October 9th at 6:30 at the Senior Citizens Center.

Councilwoman Butler attended the school board meeting.

### **WATER AND SEWER REPORT**

The month of August we had no DHEC violations.

Proposed leak equipment was posted on website for purchasing and the bids are due back October 10<sup>th</sup> and to council at the following council meeting.

RIA contract for the Water Main replacement, time line was to be completed by November 2018. We meet with the RIA staff on the project. At that time, a new time line was given to see if they could continue to honor the grant for us.

### **STREET MAINTENANCE**

Carlton Moore reported on the activities for the month of August 2018.

The floor was open for any nominations for Setoff Debt- Hearing Officer. It was a recommendation for Councilman Luongo by the Mayor. A motion to close nominations was first via Councilman Luongo and Second via Councilwoman Butler for Debt setoff Appeal Officer. Councilman Michael Luongo now holds that position.

The MASC Setoff Debt Renewal, Items A, B, C was presented for considerations on voting...(A) The agreement for the MASC to act as our claimant. A motion to accept by Councilwoman Butler and second via Councilman Luongo. It was unanimous (B) Resolution for the collection of debt by the MASC.

A motion made by Councilman Luongo and second via Councilwoman Butler. A unanimous decision on B. (C) The Resolution for Recovery of collection. A consideration and motion, first by Councilman Luongo and second by Councilwoman Butler, it was passed.

The First reading of our Bond Ordinance providing for the assurance and waterworks for the System Revenue Bond of the town of Swansea, South Carolina. Will there be a consideration for the First Reading? Councilman Luongo and second by Councilwoman Butler. Motion was made, and it was unanimous.


THE POLICE DEPARTMENT
